Update from Tina Connors Councillor – New Ross (District 6)

Request to Rezone Property Around Sherbrooke Lake: A Public Hearing is scheduled for 6:30 p.m. Thursday, August 4, where Council will consider rezoning property around Sherbrooke Lake (that within the District of Chester) from **General Basic** to **Lakeside Zone**. As with any Public Hearing, the public is encouraged to not only attend, but to bring forward comments, provide input, to ask questions.

The *Lakeside Zone* was approved by Council this past January. This zone was created in response to requests from lakeside communities seeking additional land use controls and protections for residential lakeside developments. It is



important to note that any consideration for the Lakeside Zone is the "extent" or "depth" of the application. Each request (lake) will be looked at independently based on factors like: topography; existing community character and development patterns; etc. Application of the zone would begin at the Ordinary High Water Mark and extend inland for a specified distance.

A bit of information, specific to this request:

1) The new zone is proposed to extend 300 m;

2) A Public Information Meeting was held on March 29, in New Ross at the Forties Community Centre;

3) The Municipal Planning Advisory Committee (comprised of citizen reps from all districts in the municipality) received the request along with all related background material, at its June 15 Meeting. A Motion passed unanimously to approve the rezoning with a recommendation going to Council.

Infrastructure Development Fund Policy (P-110): Stemming from discussions held during this year's strategic planning, Council has established a fund for the purposes of investment in municipal infrastructure, such as new or existing wastewater systems, to support residential and commercial development. A portion of monies generated through the Deed Transfer Tax are to be designated to the fund, on an annual basis. The fund becomes part of the effort to encourage and support healthy, sustainable growth opportunities, in our communities throughout the municipality, resulting in environmental benefits and socioeconomic returns.

I hope everyone's summer is going perfect, with just the right amount of sun, and rain, with not too many pesky bugs! Be sure to support the many activities and happenings across our community - new events, recreation programs, community suppers, and of course our annual *New Ross Community Fair* from August 19 - 20 - a truly great, fun-filled time for all ages.



Municipality supports age-friendly/affordable housing in New Ross

The New Ross Community Care Centre (NRCCC) is 100,000 steps closer to reaching its goal of providing housing for seniors and families in need of affordable housing, thanks to a generous contribution from the Municipality of the District of Chester. The NRCCC Society will use the \$100,000 contribution to purchase land for the project.

Warden Allen Webber says that the Municipality of Chester has made it a priority to engage with partners in the development of vibrant and sustainable communities. "Council is supportive of the New Ross Community Care Centre's goal of creating an age-friendly community," says Warden Webber. "We're confident that the \$100,000 grant provided by the Municipality will help kick start the development of sustainable and affordable community housing options for the area."

"We are excited to see this project advance in a substantial way," says Valerie White, president of the NRCCC. "The contribution by the Municipality not only provides funding for the land, but speaks loudly to their support of the project and to their citizens – from young families to senior citizens – who need and deserve a safe, welcoming place to live."

The land was purchased from Christ Anglican Church, New Ross. "Christ Church has also shown their support of the project by donating a portion of the purchase price," says White.

Christ Church Warden Rustin Broome sees the development as a step forward for the community. "With all the emphasis on, and the need for affordable and seniors housing now and in the foreseeable future in NS communities and beyond, this project will fill a need for those who are seeking housing," says Broome.

The site for the NRCCC project is on Rosebank Road, near the community school, resource centre, and just a short drive or walk to the heart of the community, where banking, groceries and other services are available. The site is also connected to these services through developed, well-groomed trails. The NRCCC has spent over \$40,000 to date developing the project, including a housing market study, environmental assessment and land surveys, architectural plans, brand development and communications planning, civil engineering, and site planning/service design.

The need for affordable housing in New Ross was identified as a priority by the South Shore Housing Action Coalition (SSHAC) as part of its 2017 Housing Needs Assessment, the Municipality of the District of Chester's Age Friendly Community Plan (2016) and is reinforced by reports at the municipal, provincial and federal levels, and groups like the Nova Scotia Affordable Housing Commission (2021) among others. The MODC report indicates that issues surrounding housing, which accommodate the needs of a community, are complex and require community-based solutions to address them, which is where the NRCCC project comes in. The report predicts that over 1,300 seniors with limited resources will require home care or relocation to an independent living facility by 2026, over 200 will require assisted or enriched housing, and nearly 170 will require long term care. It's clear that the need stretches beyond seniors. There are few rental options in the area for working adults and families, resulting in many younger adults leaving the area to work elsewhere.

Limited housing also prevents new families from moving in, which all has an impact on population and economic growth.

The NRCCC Board is a grassroots organization led by local volunteers (Valerie White (President), Susan Larder (Vice President), Matthew Reeves (Treasurer), Teresa Workman (Communications), Cyril Hiltz, Tina Connors, Bruce Elliott, and ongoing project management assistance from Syd Dumaresq and David Harrison). We are dedicated to the goal of providing the ability, through appropriate housing and care, to allow individuals of all ages to remain in the community of New Ross.
