### Straw Hats

#### August 10 & 11

Making hats by braiding natural fibres is considered an art by some, but at one time, it was simply a fact of life. When labourers were out all day under the hot sun, protection was a necessity. During the late 18th to early 19th centuries, the wearing of straw hats by farmers and labourers was quite common in both North America and Europe, since the materials were inexpensive and readily available. This weekend staff will be demonstrating the traditional art of Straw-hat braiding.



### Spoon Making

August 17 & 18

Wooden spoons have always been an essential utensil in kitchens around Nova Scotia and throughout the world. They come in all shapes and sizes and are used for many different purposes. This weekend our interpreters will be demonstrating the steps involved in making a wooden spoon from a block of wood in the farm workshop.




#### Nothing but the Flax



BEGINNER GENEALOGY WORKSHOP


