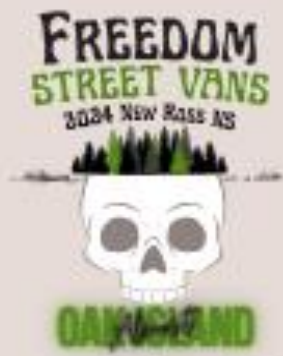

Heritage Breeds July 6 & 7

Come see the animals that are part of our agricultural history and heritage. If it weren't for these animals our forefathers probably could not have survived and we would not be here today. Now is your chance to pay tribute to these animals and see what an important role they played on the farm. Staff will be on hand to answer any questions you may have.



I Have an Axe to Grind July 20 & 21

Ross Farm staff will be on hand today to demonstrate tool sharpening techniques, using a grindstone. They will show what tools can be sharpened using the grindstone, and the proper way to use this device.



Ox Power August 3 & 4

Before the arrival of machines, work that was too hard for humans was carried out by highly trained animals. For hundreds of years, the Ox has helped to do everything from preparing the land, to moving heavy loads. This weekend you will have the opportunity to see the oxen at Ross Farm at work, chat with the teamster, and learn what made Oxen so important to settlers in rural Nova Scotia.



Straw Hats August 10 & 11

Making hats by braiding natural fibres is considered an art by some, but at one time, it was simply a fact of life. When labourers were out all day under the hot sun, protection was a necessity. During the late 18th to early 19th centuries, the wearing of straw hats by farmers and labourers was quite common in both North America and Europe, since the materials were inexpensive and readily available. This weekend staff will be demonstrating the traditional art of Straw-hat braiding.



Spoon Making August 17 & 18

Wooden spoons have always been an essential utensil in kitchens around Nova Scotia and throughout the world. They come in all shapes and sizes and are used for many different purposes. This weekend our interpreters will be demonstrating the steps involved in making a wooden spoon from a block of wood in the farm workshop.



Nothing but the Flax August 24 & 25

This weekend staff will be on hand to inform and demonstrate the steps involved from the planting of the flax seed to the spinning of the fiber.



Family Participation Days August 31 & September 1

Today is your chance to step back in time and do some everyday hands-on activities. Different activities will be scheduled each day such as wood punching, quill pen writing, taffy pull, candle dipping, grain flailing, cow milking, and blacksmithing.




Candle Making September 14 & 15

In the early 1800s the only source of light would have been by candle. Many families would have had to make their own candles or go with no light at all. Come join the staff in making dipped candles just like the settlers would have done years ago.



Pumpkin Harvest September 21 & 22

It's time to harvest the pumpkin you planted in June!

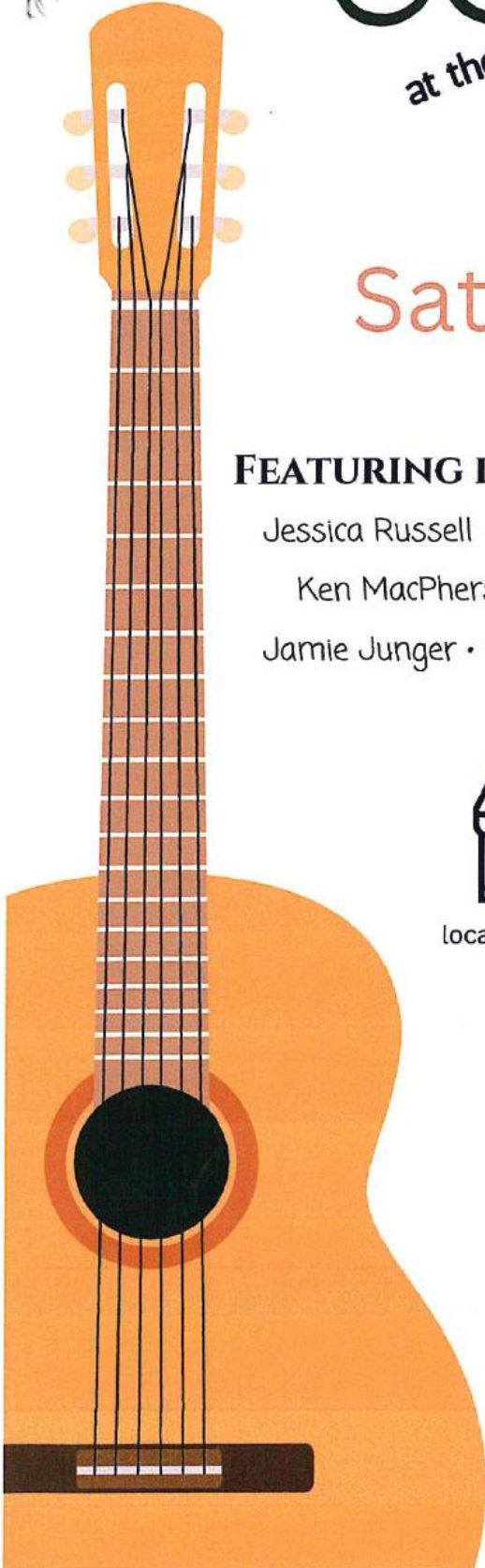

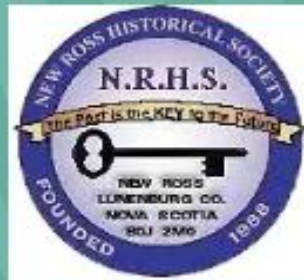

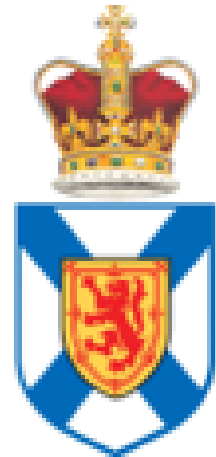
