

The quartz has six sides, weighs 145 pounds and is 27 inches long. As you can see in the picture it is a massive size! This crystal will be on display at the Museum of Natural History and is a historic specimen.

The goal of the Coping Group is to provide participants with some tools to help with issues such as anxiety and depression. Using an approach based on the principles of Cognitive Behaviour Therapy (CBT), participants are given guidance in identifying the ways in which their thoughts, feelings and behaviours are interconnected. While not a substitute for individual therapy, the support of peers that is available in a group format can be very powerful in facilitating ongoing change and personal growth. Each session includes opportunities to reflect on personal experiences, introduction of new tools and concepts, as well as coaching regarding mindfulness and mindful meditation.




participating in a Women's Unlimited Program that led to a career with Michelin in Bridgewater.

# Community Spotlight





Many residents of New Ross are aware of a treasured camp nearby our community just up and off the Forties Road, in what is known as Franey Corner. Many would have attended this camp as children and then sent their children. Some may not be aware that Sherbrooke Lake Camp even exists. This year the Camp will be celebrating 60 years of camping and therefore is this month's Community Spotlight.

After the closing of the Pinehurst camping grounds in the late 1950s United Church camping had come to a halt. 4 Presbyterian groups, Lunenburg-Queens, Yarmouth, Annapolis and Windsor, started searching for a new camp site. The present site was selected by a committee in 1963 and originally consisted of 1000 acres owned by the widow of the late Ira Rhodenizer. The Church was able to acquire 80 acres.

The camp includes a 20x70 main lodge with a veranda and attached 20x20 kitchen. Two cabins were originally built and not long after two more were added. Electricity came around 1967 and the chapel was started in 1969. Kentville U.C. men had a 200lb steam locomotive bell and stand made from rail totalling over 1000lbs which was brought in by oxen. The cross was erected at this time and the 3x6 sign placed by the main road. The camp had 11 cabins by 1969. The camp became a charitable organization in February 1976.

Currently there are 9 stand-alone cabins that sleep 8 campers each in the main room in 4 sets

of bunkbeds. There is a change room for privacy and a backroom for the counsellor and counsellor-in-training. The cabins are new since 2017 - built by local community members and students at NSCC! The cabins maintain the natural camping experience and don't have power. Close to each cabin is a set of latrines. Latrines decrease the carbon footprint and impact on water usage at camp!

A rustic camp nestled deep in the woods is just what kids today need! The camp is a place for kids to be themselves, to



learn new skills, unplug, develop independence, meet great friends, eat home-cooked meals and everyone is welcome! Sherbrooke Lake Camp prides itself on their commitment to respect the natural environment, the waterways and the kilometre-long sandy beach where campers swim, canoe, laugh, sing and play!

Sherbrooke Lake Camp is an affirming camp with gender inclusive cabins, opportunities to explore spirituality and ask questions about faith. Regardless of faith or beliefs, campers of all backgrounds are welcome and invited to join their safe space.

Sherbrooke Lake Camp is inviting everyone to help celebrate 60 years of friendship, memories and fun with their 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Homecoming Weekend August 2-4, 2024. 




